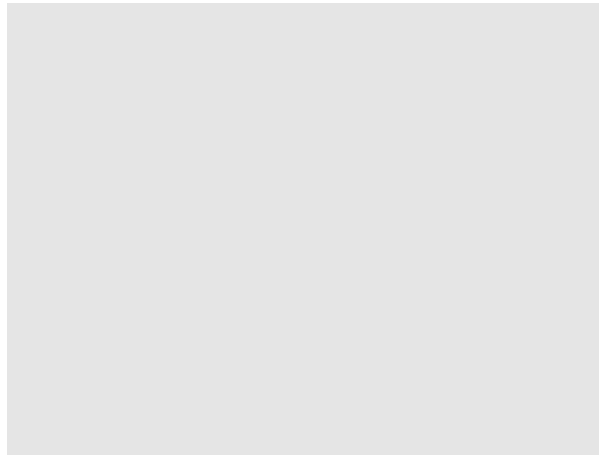

WKU names new vice president for philanthropy

Western Kentucky University has named a new vice president for philanthropy and alumni engagement.

Amanda Trabue, who began her career at WKU, will return to campus and assume her new role June 17. Her most recent position was associate dean of the Peabody College of Education and Human Development at Vanderbilt University in Nashville.

“Amanda’s 17 years of experience in development and alumni relations will be valuable in her new role,” WKU President Timothy Caboni said in a news release. “We’re thrilled to welcome her back to the Hill.”

Trabue, who earned her bachelor’s in marketing and master’s in business administration from WKU, started her career as coordinator and assistant director of alumni relations and annual giving at WKU in 2002, according to the news release.



She later became director of development for the Gordon Ford College of Business at WKU in 2005, and then went on to hold development positions at Washington University in St. Louis and at Vanderbilt.

Trabue replaces John Paul Blair, who has served as interim vice president for philanthropy and alumni engagement since 2017. Blair will become special assistant to the president for philanthropy and leadership giving.
