North Hardin's next principal found in-house

North Hardin High School Principal Jeff Maysey has been named the new principal. Maysey has been working as the assistant principal since 2016.

A North Hardin High School assistant principal will be the school's top administrator for the 2021-22 school year.

The school's site-based decision-making council asked Jeff Maysey to be the Trojans' next leader.

"I am so honored to be a part of Trojan Nation," Maysey said in a news release. "The North Hardin High School family is comprised of tremendous students, staff, families and alumni. I look forward to serving our school as principal and to maintain the legacy of success and pride."

Maysey is a Breckinridge County High School graduate and earned a bachelor's degree in exceptional child education, a master's degree in education and a Rank I in administration from Western Kentucky University. He has served as an assistant principal at North Hardin since 2016.

"Mr. Maysey has been an important part of North Hardin's success since he arrived," HCS Superintendent Teresa Morgan said in the release. "His experiences in and out of the classroom and the principal's office will help him keep North Hardin High School among the state's best. I know he will do

great things.”

After a six-year stint as a broadcast journalist in the U.S. Army, Maysey started teaching.

He was asked to serve as the principal at Bonnieville Elementary School in Hart County in 2004. He also has been the principal at Eastern Elementary School in Barren County, according to the release.

Maysey went back to the classroom and then was asked to be an assistant principal at Allen-County Scottsville High School. A family move led him to Jessamine County Schools, where he served as a coach in the Positive Approach to Student Success program.

Another family move brought him to North Hardin in 2016.

“The people at North Hardin are like family,” he said in the release. “Our students have a deep passion for learning and exceeding their goals. Our staff is magnificent because they have the experience, the resources and the talent in helping our students succeed.”

Maysey replaces Tanya Corder, who will become the school district’s director of high school curriculum, instruction and assessment this summer.
