







First, this survey is not anonymous. The SA program graduates a very small number of students each semester and its really easy to figure out which students are responding. It's difficult for students to be 100% honest if we know that our instructors will be able to figure out who said what. Given what I learned from Research Methods and Assessment, your survey needs to be redesigned if you want accurate results. Second, there is an extreme difference between professors in the program. One is engaged with the students, attends events, is responsive to emails/calls, etc, comes to class prepared, and puts forth effort in connecting and helping students. The other professor does not participate in events. If they do attend, they are withdrawn and only interacts with a very small selective group of students. The other professor does not go out of their way to assist students. Lastly, this professor is not well prepared for class usually. Quite frankly, this professor is disruptive in class since their cell phone is always set to ring and the phone chimes and rings constantly. In my opinion, there is absolutely no need for the internship class to be 6 credit hours. Completing 2 200 hour internships is not feasible for every student; especially those what work full time. The essay option for the class has questions that repeat themselves so for 25 pages, we're saying the same thing over and over. If a full time student does not have time to complete an internship, it's very difficult for them to complete a research project as well. Also, making students complete research in a manner to be published is ridiculous. Most students don't want or care to be published. One class for internship is needed. Also, it would probably serve the students best if the instructor would address cover letters and resumes in all internship classes. Those that aren't lucky enough to get that information in the fall are essentially screwed if their job hunts are in the spring/summer.

Dr. Hughey and Dr. Burke are fantastic instructors and have a deep understanding of the field of student affairs. While some of their ideas and philosophies may differ, they are. Wry good at allowing and encouraging students to express their own opinions in class and striving to challenge student ideas. This program helped to prepare me for my current position as an admissions counselor and I know it will continue to prepare students for a career in this field.
