# Q11 - If you received a scholarship award while you were a graduate student here, in what year(s) did you receive the award?










# Q28 - If you gained employment in your respective field, how long after you graduated were you employed?





### Q29 - If you gained employment, where did you secure employment? (APR B.5)




# Q30 - After graduation, did you/do you plan to seek graduate/professional school admission (i.e., doctoral degree program)? (APR B.5)





The direction in which the program is going is extremely beneficial having more opportunities for students to network with other styles of teachings!

Cost of tuition is unethical.

I enjoyed the classes that were experiential and skill based. Group projects and research papers did little to prepare me for sitting with a client. it is important to have professionals that want to do research. Maybe there needs to be a research option or a skill based option. The faculty is amazing and so compassionate. I experienced extreme care.

Ok, here goes: I so appreciate the time and effort that Dr. Hughey and Dr. Burke put into changing and modifying the program or classes in accordance to feedback and assessment. I know that they care so much and put their hearts and souls into preparing the next generations of Student Affairs practitioners. However, like the true INFJ that I am, I do have a few suggestions and praises (of course!). I really enjoy that we have a bit of choice with the electives in the program. I like being able to choose a bit of a focus for the program. Within that, I do think that Resource Management should be a required class. I think it is very important and that information really isn't present elsewhere. You get a little bit of budgeting with Leadership and Administration, but having a complete framework as a background is so helpful! Plus, LaDonna is SUCH a great teacher and an expert in her field. I also think it would be interesting to have an elective class focused on grant writing or something similar. With higher education budgets seemingly always shrinking, I think that knowing how to access grants and write great ones could help supplement your department's budget. I also think it is a unique and marketable skill to have when entering the industry. Also, it may be interesting to have an enrollment management elective as well (I think you may have once had this in the program so maybe you know that it's not a necessary or popular class), but it is something that I could see being beneficial depending on your career goals. I also felt that the College Student Experience class is redundant in its topics. I feel that most of these topics are already covered in other classes for those in the Student Affairs program or could very easily be inserted into other classes that we take. I think this course may be good for those who may be interested in working with student populations but aren't in the Student Affairs program. However, to me, it felt very redundant in connection with the other classes in the program. I enjoyed so many of my courses: College Student Development, Social and Cultural Diversity, Counseling Concepts, Group Dynamics, and Resource Management were some of the ones I felt particularly drawn to. Like I mentioned earlier in the survey, I feel very prepared to go out there and be the best SA professional that I can!

Thanks for a wonderful experience! I am so thankful the Student Affairs program here at WKU and all of the doors it has opened for me!
