

### Q1 - What month did you complete your counseling degree?













### Q8 - Have you taken the National Certified Counselor exam?





### Q9 - If so, did you pass it?





Q10 - If you were eligible to become a school counselor, did you take obtain your School Counseling certification?





### Q11 - How satisfied are you with your experience in the WKU counseling program?




