2 Applicants who have earned a B.S. degree in engineering or related STEM fields with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher are exempt from taking the GRE.

Current students at WKU who seek the JUMP program in one of the undergraduate baccalaureate programs in the School of Engineering and Applied Sciences (SEAS) with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher are exempt from taking the GRE.
