Firstly, the SGA Safe Space will be available for students past our regular office hours of 9-5, Monday-Friday, until Finals Week. This is a welcoming space for any student where they can simply eat dinner, do homework, and talk with friends without facing danger or threats.

Secondly, SGA has created a new, temporary initiative called SafeWalk, where students can simply call (270) 261-9831 and be immediately connected with a student if they need someone to walk with them on campus, regardless of the location. We have implemented this immediately following the election due to high demand and it will be used until Finals Week as well.
