Bill 18-22-F. Funding for the GFCB and WKU Career Fair Scholarships.

PURPOSE: For the Student Government Association of Western Kentucky University to allocate \$1,500 for the Gordon Ford College of Business and WKU Career Fair Scholarships.

WHEREAS: \$1000 will come from Legislative Discretionary fund and \$500 will come from Executive Discretionary fund, and

WHEREAS: As part of SGA's responsibility to better the future of each individual student, this bill would encourage and incentivize students to show up to these two career fairs, and

WHEREAS: The Advising and Career Development Center will be having two career fairs in the Spring which are the Gordon Ford College of Business and WKU Career Fair. The Gordon Ford College of Business Career Fair will be held on February 15th, and the WKU Career Fair will be held on March 1st, and

WHEREAS: Between the two career fairs, every major and minor will be represented, providing every student on campus eligibility for the scholarship contingent on their attendance, and

WHEREAS: Three scholarships valued at \$250 a piece will be awarded after each respective career fair, and

WHEREAS: Eligibility for these scholarships only includes the student's attendance and signing into the table at the fair, and

WHEREAS: A student's eligibility for the remaining scholarships is removed once they have received one of these awards, and

WHEREAS: These scholarships will be selected through a randomized raffle, and

WHEREAS: SGA will have tabling opportunities that count towards office hours at each career fair.
