## **SGA Senate Meeting Minutes**

- The twenty-second meeting of the sixteenth Senate was called to order by Ryan Richardson at 5:00 pm on March 27<sup>th</sup>, 2018.
- The minutes from the last Senate meeting were approved by unanimous consent.
- Guest Speaker Kristina Gamble (Intercultural Student Engagement Center): She gives an overview of the ISEC program. They aid the university in three areas: recruitment, increasing retention rates of underrepresented minority students, and increasing graduation rates of underrepresented minority students. ISEC Academy is a support program for underrepresented minority students teaching them how to be successful both as a college student and a graduate following college. ISEC Academy is also a Living-Learning Community. Their office is open from 8am-8pm for all students to utilize their study spaces and computers. However, those wishing to be a member of the ISEC Academy must fill out an application.
- President Andi Dahmer: They kicked off sexual assault awareness month yesterday. Attorney General Andy Beshear was present at the event yesterday and stated that "if you see something, say something." Andi also supports the legislation to fund Take Back the Night t-shirts. Faculty Senate. There may be changes to tenure on the state level. They are potentially changing the KRS to enable the Board of Agents to remove a faculty or staff member, even if they have tenure. The Faculty Senate also published an Aramark resolution similar to the SGA resolution. They are also working to help push back the student withdraw date. She does not support the bill making a constitutional amendment allowing the speaker to appoint committee chairs because she is already one of the weakest student body presidents in Kentucky. Moreover, the committee chairs appointed by the president are confirmed by a 2/3 vote from the Senate. The Speaker of the Senate is supposed to be an unbiased role, which is not possible if they appoint committee chairs. This is because the committee chairs have the ability to sponsor legislation; therefore, allowing the speaker to appoint committee chairs would allow them to set the agenda.
