## **SGA Senate Meeting Minutes**

- The twenty-sixth meeting of the sixteenth Senate was called to order by Ryan Richardson at 5:00 pm on April 24<sup>th</sup>, 2018.
- The minutes from the last Senate meeting were approved by unanimous consent.
- Voting on awards is conducted.
- President Andi Dahmer: This is her final officer report. She supports Resolution 11-18-S and 10-18-S. She thanks everyone for attending the provost meetings. The presidential transition is underway between Andi and Stephen. They will have 3 total transitional meetings. The 2018-2020 biannual budget is discussed. Both chambers voted to override the governor's veto on the budget and revenue bills. The Budget Council will have a less direct impact on this round of \$16 million cuts. President Caboni still aims to support students throughout these programmatic cuts. If a position is already vacant, it will be cut in lieu of one that is already filled. The newly selected provost will be the ones leading this programmatic revue. He's working to prevent the attrition of students and the decline in international enrollment. She thanks everyone for letting her serve this year.
- Executive Vice President Savannah Molyneaux: They are currently working on
  the project for the sexual assault awareness with the Talisman. She addresses the
  awful year they've had as an all-woman executive member of senate. She believes
  both sexism and racism are alive and well on this campus. The importance of
  holding others accountable is stressed.
