Summary of the Program's Assessment Plan | Generalist Practice

WKU's BSW Program uses two measures: 1) the SWEAP (Social Work Education Assessment Project) Exit Foundation Curriculum Assessment Instrument (FCAI) and 2) the Learning Plan Evaluation (LPE) to assess students' mastery of the nine competencies that comprise the Educational Policy and Accreditation Standards of the Council on Social Work Education.

The SWEAP-FCAI is a multi-dimensional assessment of a student's knowledge related to each of the nine competencies made available to graduating students online at the end of the second semester of their Field Practica (during SWRK 483: Field Practicum II). The LPE is completed by a graduating student's Field Instructor at the end of two semesters in their Field Practicum (SWRK 483: Field Practicum II). The Field Instructor evaluates whether the student has effectively demonstrated each of the 31 behaviors associated with the nine competencies.

During AY 21-22, 81 students completed WKU's BSW Program. All (n = 81) students completed the *LPE* for a 100% response rate across all Program Options. Seventy-nine (n = 79) students completed the *SWEAP-FCAI* with an overall response rate of 97.5% for all Program Options. The response rate for each Program Option was as follows: WKU Bowling Green (98.3%) and WKU Elizabethtown-Fort Knox (95.2%)

WKU's BSW Program uses an 85% Benchmark to determine students' competencies. At least 85% of graduating students are expected to demonstrate threshold mastery of each CSWE competency as measured by the combined *LPE* and *SWEAP-FCAI* assessment measures.
