There was consensus that GRE/GAP cutoffs for the MAE IECE advanced cert program, as well as the MAE Special Education LBD program to be presented as the next item on the agenda, would have inserted in the proposals the GRE/GAP scores agreed to by the STE faculty, or the GRE/GAP scores established by Graduate Council, whichever is higher. The motion passed.
