Other Business

One report from the Alternate Admissions Subcommittee was presented for information.

There was discussion of a special admissions process for students from Indiana Wesleyan University who may apply for admission to Western. Based on the circumstances, the committee agreed to support an informal proposal (if also approved by program faculty) to admit conditionally to our MAE programs IWU students who apply by June 30, 2007, and who meet all admissions requirements (including program-specific requirements) except the GAP score and GRE Analytical Writing score requirements. The students' full admission will be contingent upon achieving the GAP and GRE Writing scores required. Students who do not achieve the qualifying scores will have three options: study for and re-take the GRE, apply for admission to a Planned Fifth-Year program, or apply for admission under the college's alternate admission policy. There was a Kindsvatter/Mikovch motion to approve/second. The motion was approved. There was further discussion of the special advising and instructional needs that these students may have.
