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Goals of the Rank I in Library Media Education:

- The objectives of the Planned Sixth-Year (Rank I) in Library Media Education are to provide opportunities to school media librarians and educational technology specialists to accomplish one or more of the following:
- Expand professional knowledge in contemporary content and issues in library media/educational technology.
- Advance knowledge and skills that meet the needs of professionals in library media/educational technology.
- Expand pedagogical skills of library media/educational technology specialists to address literacy and the needs of diverse learners.
- Enhance professional effectiveness of library media/educational technology specialists for leadership and service at the local, regional, state, and national levels.
- Offer broader professional opportunities to library media/educational technology specialists through additional endorsements and certifications.
- Advance skills of library media/educational technology specialists that foster collaboration and communication with colleagues and parents.

Requirements for Admission to the Planned Sixth Year (Rank I) in Library Media Education:

The Planned Sixth-Year (Rank I) in Library Media Education is open to applicants who meet the following admission requirements:

- An approved application for admission to graduate study.
- Copies of transcripts for all college work.
- Evidence of Kentucky Rank II status with Kentucky Media Librarian (KML) certification or Kentucky Rank II/5th Year with an Instructional Computer Technology Endorsement.

Applicants with a Planned Fifth-Year (Rank II) from an institution other than WKU must complete the MS in LME for initial certification as a Kentucky media librarian at the Sixth-Year (Rank 1) level.

- 1. Rank I status requires the completion of a minimum of either (a) 30 semester hours of unduplicated and approved credit beyond the requirements for the Planned Fifth Year (Rank II) classification or (b) 60 semester hours of approved and unduplicated graduate level credit including a master's degree. Students must meet the admission requirements required by academic programs for additional certifications and/or endorsements, and university certificate programs appropriate to a specialization.
- 2. The Planned Sixth Year (Rank I) program shall be planned individually with each candidate in consideration his/her prior experience, certifications, career goals, and areas identified for professional growth.
- 3. The Rank I program shall be a major component of the candidate's continued professional growth and shall be consistent with the achievement of the Kentucky Teacher Standards at the bachelor's/fifth year (Rank II) levels, and/or consistent with appropriate national standards.
- 4. A minimum of 15 semester hours must be in courses open only to graduate students.
- 5. The student shall maintain a B average, and no credit shall be applied for a course grade lower than a C.
- 6. At least 15 of the program hours shall be taken at Western Kentucky University. The remaining hours may be taken at other institutions, provided the grade is A or B, and with the approval of the graduate advisor and the certification officer.
- 7. A minimum of 24 hours of the total 60 hours (62 when based upon the Rank II Planned Fifth Year Classification) must be in (1) the candidate's non-professional education courses or (2) in supporting courses from other disciplines as approved by this institution

- 8. Professional Development Credit: Professional development of up to twelve (12) semester hours of college credit shall be approved as part of a Rank I Program if requested by the applicant using the following guidelines:
 - a. The candidate shall seek and obtain prior approval of Western Kentucky University for the professional development activities.
 - b. The application for approval shall identify the specific professional development activities, and the strategy to achieve one or more goals of the professional improvement plan identified above. This information will be included in the student's in the Student's Professional Improvement Plan.
 - c. Upon completion of the professional development activities, the candidate shall submit to Western Kentucky University a reflective report of the activities which include an evaluation of the experiences and a follow-up method implementing the professional development and growth.
 - d. Twenty-four (24) clock hours of professional development shall equal one (1) semester hours.

Program Sequence:

- 1. Applicant meets requirements for admission to the program with a complete file of all transcripts and official documentation of teaching certificate(s).
- 2. Applicant submits a written professional growth statement/plan to his/her designated advisor and consults with the designated advisor on the preparation of a planned program study (Form B/C) that is consistent with the goals and structure of the curriculum for the Planned Sixth Year (Rank I) program in LME. The Form B/C is approved by the advisor and the Office for Teacher Certification, and a copy is forwarded to the office of Graduate Studies.
- 3. Prior to enrollment beyond 15 credit hours, the candidate submits a progress report to his/her advisor that consists of a reflective essay about achievement to that point and any changes in his/her original professional growth statement/plan.
- 4. Candidate informs the advisor of his/her enrollment in the last semester of enrollment in the program of study and submits a progress report to the advisor that consists of a reflective essay of achievement, explanation of professional growth, and a plan for future continued professional growth.
- 5. Candidates must follow the approved program of study (Form B/C). Changes in a program of study must be made in consultation with the advisor and approved by the Office for Teacher Certification.
