Moore, C. *Child welfare cultures: Identifying gendered barriers to state-specific and national child protective services*. A mixed-methods ethnographic study of state-to-state bureaucratic child welfare cultures conveyed through the perceptions and experiences of practicing child protective services specialists. This project involves developing and administering an original survey along with in-depth qualitative interviews of CPS workers throughout the United States.

An evaluative study of the development of a center for community-engaged experiential learning that focuses on the collaboration among interdisciplinary faculty, multiple sectors of Appalachian communities, and the student experience of academic, leadership, and professional development.

Moore, C. & Shell, M. *Community building in first-year college experience seminar*. A retroactive study of how we created a community of learners and taught college and community norms, even if we are not in the classroom. We developed a system for co-teaching an online synchronous freshman seminar course which provided students with a caring community, opportunities to engage socially, and the skills needed to succeed at college. Tools such as online chat, breakout sessions, and assigned partners were used to promote engagement among students. In addition, the online format of the course enabled the use of different activities than those available in a tradition classroom including things like polling, internet searches, and collaborative resource documents developed by students.
