As the iHOPE Project Director, I was responsible for leading an interdisciplinary team of six service providers and support staff to achieve the mission and goals of LifeSkills, to meet fidelity of the federal and state grants that partially funded iHOPE, and to provide specialized services and interventions for clients with psychosis-like experiences. I assisted the Children's Services Director and the accounting department in the development of the iHOPE budget and oversaw iHOPE spending. I led weekly meetings with the iHOPE team, the Children's Services Director, and a psychiatric mental health nurse practitioner. I was part of monthly meetings with representatives from Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and other professionals across the nation. I collected data for program evaluation and completed monthly progress reports that were submitted at the state and federal level. I also organized community and organization trainings, created contracts, held individual supervision meetings for all iHOPE staff, completed annual employee performance reviews, and worked proactively to address all employee and consumer complaints.
