What: Removal of ramp – installation of stairs

Issue Addressed: EHS requested that the ramp be removed as a safety concern and replacement with steps. The wooden ramp had become uneven and the IT folks using the ramp had addressed the issue via EHS. This is condition-based renewal.

Funding: \$2700 (320204)

Method: Outsource (Kramer)



What: Water remediation/rebuild of CEC

Issue Addressed: A faucet was left running over a weekend at CEC resulting in moderate flooding/water damage. The wall had to be dried and refinished. This is condition-based renewal.

Funding: \$9671.04 (FM Global)

Method: Outsource/Insource (Paul Davis/AT4)



What: Rebuild of Pump.

Issue Addressed: 1/1 pump was leaking excessively – bearings, seals, shaft sleeves replaced. Pump aligned. This is condition-based renewal.

Funding: \$3345.67 (929809)

Method: Outsource (Southern Electric)




What: Pump Rebuild.

Issue Addressed: This pump failed last fall fur to sheared shaft. Bearing assembly replaced, shaft manufactured and installed, pump aligned. Pump had to be nursed along until we could obtain parts. Cost includes the incremental cost. This is condition-based renewal.



Method: Outsource/Insource (Southern Electric/Wimpees Welding/AT4)






