## **External Advisory Committee:**

## University of Kansas MPH

The External Advisory Board provides feedback through in-person meetings held once every two years in additional to completing periodic surveys on program components and recommendations. We last conducted a survey in 2015. Although the External Advisory Board (EAB) physically meets as a group once every two years, faculty and members of the MPH Operations committee interact with all sectors represented by the EAB on a regular basis. For example, we interact with local health department representatives of the EAB every semester to place MPH students for their internships. The MPH Operations team members also participate and are active in the Public Health Systems Group (PHSG) meetings that are held quarterly. Stakeholders from local health departments, the state health department, state-wide associations, and other public health entities are all represented and provide input into how to strengthen the KU-MPH Program.

## **UNC External Advisory Committee**

The Gillings School's External Advisory Committee consists of seven senior leaders in public health from external organizations (three current/former deans of schools of public health) who provide input into our academic and research programs; identify potential academic concerns and issues and to provide advice on best practices; and provide perspective regarding how other schools of public health handle issues such as faculty governance, indirect costs, global health and centers. This committee convenes approximately once every 18 months.

## University of Illinois MPH

Committee: MPH Advisory (External) Function: To provide a forum for input by MPH program constituents into the governance and operation of the MPH Program. The committee may provide review and guidance on any aspect of the MPH program, including policies, procedures, curriculum, and outreach. 43 CEPH Self-Study | University of Illinois Master of Public Health Membership: The committee members are recommended by Public Health Faculty and approved by the Department Head. All committee members have voting privileges. The committee meets once per semester.
