APPENDIX B

This is the final graduate enrollment report for the Spring 2018 term. The final enrollment was 2576 (compared to Spring 2017, enrollment is -73).

Some things to note in this report:

- The change in foreign student enrollment (-109) is greater than the overall deficit
- The residency classification of "Military" continues to increase (202 in 2018; +63 vs. 2017)
- A decrease in the number of students with primary enrollment in a master's programs (-81)

Note: this report uses unduplicated headcount, which counts each student only in their primary program/department. This predominantly affects certificate program enrollments, as they tend to be secondary programs. If you need more specific information about duplicated headcount (i.e., students simultaneously enrolled in multiple programs), please let me know.
